

RESIDENTS OF FORISTELL IMPORTANT ELECTION NOTICE

On April 6th the City will have the following question on the election ballot for your consideration.

QUESTION

Shall the City of Foristell issue revenue bonds in the principal amount of up to \$1,700,000 to provide for the cost of improving and extending its sewerage system, such bonds to be payable from the revenues to be derived from the operation of such sewerage system and existing sources of revenue?

THIS IS A NO TAX INCREASE BOND ISSUE

The Department of Natural Resources has mandated environmental improvements to sewer systems that use a lagoon system for wastewater treatment. The design and installation of a UV Lighting System needed to treat the three lagoon cells we currently have would be extremely costly, and would not improve our current capacity or allow for future growth.

An alternative to expensive treatment of the lagoon would be to install a lift station that will pump the wastewater to Public Water Supply District #2's MBR Sewer Treatment Plant off Cotton Road for processing. We anticipate the cost to wholesale the wastewater to be similar to the cost of our current treatment requirements.

The City is very supportive of the Clean Water Act and the impact public utilities have on the environment. We feel it is in the best interest of our community to take measures now to improve and expand our sanitary sewer system. With voter approval we will issue revenue bonds up to \$1,700,000 to design, build and operate an environmentally friendly alternative to our current system.
